

## Research Awareness

### Guidance

**The table over page was developed by East Anglia DeNDRoN and Norfolk & Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust**, in response to the Prime Ministers Challenge on Dementia that 10% of all people with dementia should be participating in clinical research trials/studies by 2015. This makes it part of everyone's business to have at least a basic awareness of dementia research provision for our patients/clients. Increasingly service users are asking clinicians about research opportunities available to them as part of their clinical care, so it is important that you are able to at least signpost as appropriate. This research awareness 'tool' is designed to support you to do this.

The Trust will be including a section on Research Awareness in its annual appraisal records. Everyone will be required to reach at least the basic awareness reflected in Level 1 in the table.

To support you to do this the table has been designed to be used during clinical supervision. The intention is that the supervisee and supervisor will work together to visit the websites listed in the left hand column in the table. This will enable both members of staff to fill any gaps they may have in their dementia research awareness. Those with a particular interest in research may wish to become more actively involved and work towards achieving awareness levels 2 or 3. However, everyone should develop sufficient dementia research awareness to be able to:

- provide basic information about dementia research studies to people with dementia
- contact the Trust R&D department and local research networks (DeNDRoN and MHRN)
- gain permission from service users, for DeNDRoN to approach them in the future, to offer them the opportunity to participate in appropriate dementia research studies.
- find information about professional development and/or career opportunities in research.
